

MADRID: ECONOMIC FORCE AND LAND OF OPPORTUNITY

Regarded as the fifth region in Europe in terms of GDP, Madrid holds the **2nd position as a continental city** with greater Greenfield cross-border investment projects and is also the fourth continental city with a larger number of start-ups.

Madrid is arguably a major economic force and a remarkable talent hub. Its privileged location and connections place Madrid at the peak of the world's digital map. It is also the capital of the Spanish language, one of the languages with the greater economic projection on the entire planet, with a market of 600 million speakers.

Madrid is the main driver of the Spanish economy, and is also the 5th region by GDP in the European Union.




Metropolitan area with over **7.5 million** inhabitants
